Winter squash - 1 in a $1 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$ space
Tomatoes - 1 (need trellis)
Okra-1
Space saver: A 1 square space planted with a large, long-season crop like tomatoes, can be inter-planted with fast-maturing crops such as lettuce or radishes that will be harvested before the tomato matures and needs the space.
