



How many seeds/plants to a square?

Use also to "rate" your 16 favorite vegetables.
Save a square for herbs or flowers!

Beans: Bush - 9; Pole - 2 rows, 4" apart, 4 seeds each row for each square (need trellis)

Beets - 16

Broccoli - 1

Cabbage - 1

Carrots - 16

Cauliflower - 1

Swiss chard - 4

Corn - 4

Eggplant - 1

Lettuce (and other "greens") - 4

Melons - 1 in 2 squares

Onions - 16

Parsley - 4

Peas - 2 rows 4" apart, 4 seeds each row for each square

Pepper - 1

Radishes - 16

Spinach - 9

Summer squash - 1 in a 3ft x 3ft space (cannot use in the 4ft x 4ft garden)

Winter squash - 1 in a 1ft x 2ft space

Tomatoes - 1 (need trellis)

Okra - 1

Space saver: A 1 square space planted with a large, long-season crop like tomatoes, can be inter-planted with fast-maturing crops such as lettuce or radishes that will be harvested before the tomato matures and needs the space.
